

## Summary

### Student Responsibilities of 3<sup>rd</sup> Year Surgery Discipline (Basic Core 1)

#### Student Responsibilities Prior to Subspecialty Clinics

1. Review clinic patients for upcoming day's clinic.
2. Concentrate on new clinic visits.
3. Identify patient problems and prepare for history and exam for those new patient encounters.

#### Student Responsibilities During Clinic

1. Have your faculty guide which patients to encounter.
2. Emphasize new clinic visits.
3. **Free text EpicCare note.**
4. Keep note in patient log.
5. **Identify learning objectives for each patient with the faculty.**
6. Email faculty case and assessment form: include completed learning objective(s) in "comment" section of patient log.

#### Student Responsibilities Prior to OR

1. Use patient log to follow up on work-up.
2. Identify operative date by "hospital encounter" noted on EpicCare.
3. Contact the Faculty's office the day prior to surgery for approximate case time; or access ORIS for scheduled time.
4. Prepare for OR learning objectives.
5. If your patient is not a first scheduled case; call **into the OR** to find out the approximate start time.

#### Student Responsibilities

1. Prepare and participate fully in anticipated operation.
2. Establish new learning objectives.
3. Coordinate inpatient follow up of the patient with the resident team.
4. Email faculty assessment form.

#### Ward Experience

1. Integrate on inpatient team as directed by senior surgical resident and faculty.
2. Goal is to attend surgeries on patients seen pre-operatively, either in clinic or as inpatients (hospital transfers or consults).
3. See inpatient consults as directed by senior resident or faculty.
4. Attend outpatient clinics with faculty on your team.

5. Similar subspecialty clinics, evaluate patients identified by your faculty, free text a patient encounter progress note and review with faculty, obtain a learning objective for each encounter.
6. Email your faculty 2 – 4 patient encounters per week with completed learning objective.
7. Email your faculty OR assessments only for patients that you have seen preoperatively and should total 8 per rotation. Each OR assessment should also include a completed learning objective.

### **Surgery Call**

1. Assess surgical consults both in the emergency room and floor as directed by the residents on the night float team.
2. Contact the resident on service for night float team at 6:00 pm to arrange meeting them to shadow them.
3. Call is to 11:00 pm, unless the student wants to attend OR or is participating in an operative case.
4. Email resident an assessment form for patient encounters.
